OREGON HEALTH PROFESSIONS: OCCUPATIONAL AND COUNTY PROFILES, 2011 AND 2013

In conjunction with participating health profession licensing boards and the Office for Oregon Health Policy and Research, OHWI analyzes demographic and practice data for health care occupations to inform public policy and educational investments.

PROFILES OF OREGON'S HEALTH OCCUPATIONS

OHWI has produced individual profiles on physicians, dentists, pharmacists, occupational therapists and physical therapists and continues to analyze data for subsequent reports.

THE ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTIONS OF OREGON'S HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE

This study estimates the economic contribution of Oregon's health care workforce per county and statewide.

THE ECONOMIC CONTRIBUTIONS OF OREGON'S PHYSICIAN PRACTICES, 2010 AND 2013

This study estimates the economic impact that a single physician has on a local economy and cumulative state economy.

PREPARING OREGON'S WORKFORCE FOR HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY TRANSFORMATION

OHWI convened a statewide brain trust to develop a plan to build an HIT workforce and to train the health care workforce in the use of electronic health records. The plan has supported grant applications, Oregon's HIT Oversight Council's strategic plan, program development, and stakeholder partnerships.

A SUPPLY TREND ANALYSIS OF SELECT HIGH-DEMAND CLINICAL HEALTH OCCUPATIONS

This study reports graduate data and projections from Oregon's health profession training programs from 2007 through 2012. A similar report was published in 2007.

HIGH-DEMAND CLINICAL HEALTH CARE OCCUPATIONS IN OREGON'S WORKFORCE REGIONS

With information from the concurrent supply trend analysis, this report presents information on occupations that require post-secondary training of up to two years.

INVENTORY OF GRANTS & INVESTMENTS IN OREGON'S HEALTHCARE WORKFORCE

This compilation describes investments in health career education from industry, government, education and organizations. A similar report was published in 2007.

INVENTORIES OF EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

These charts list the Oregon public high schools with health science career programs, Oregon post-secondary institutions with graduates from clinical health profession programs and non-Oregon-based schools with health care-related external placements in Oregon.
